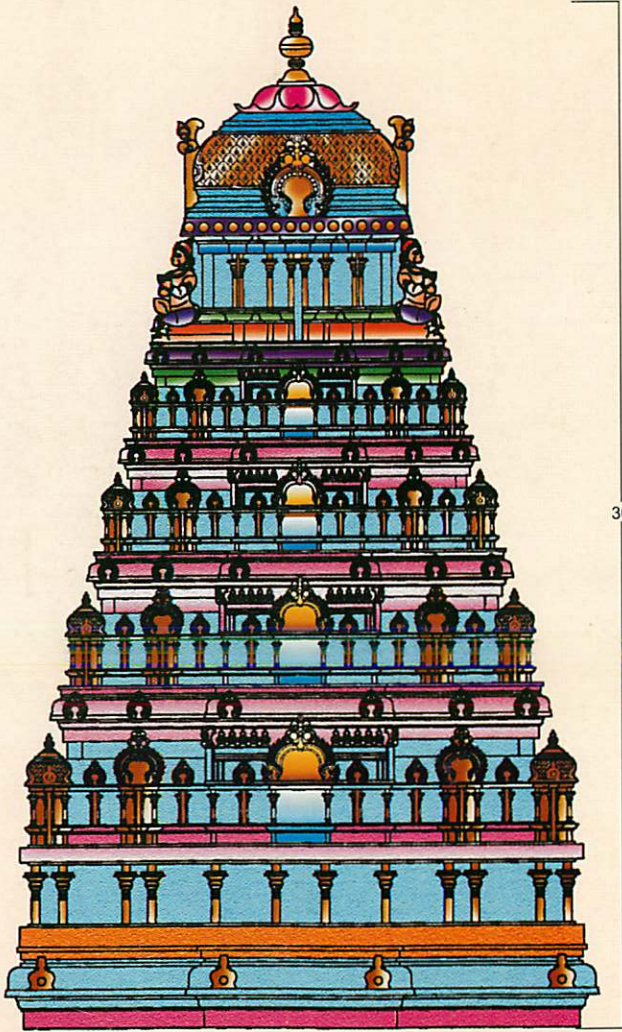

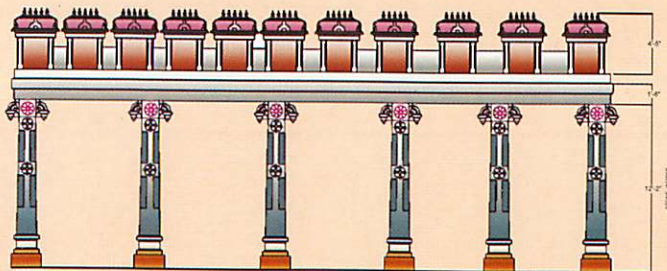
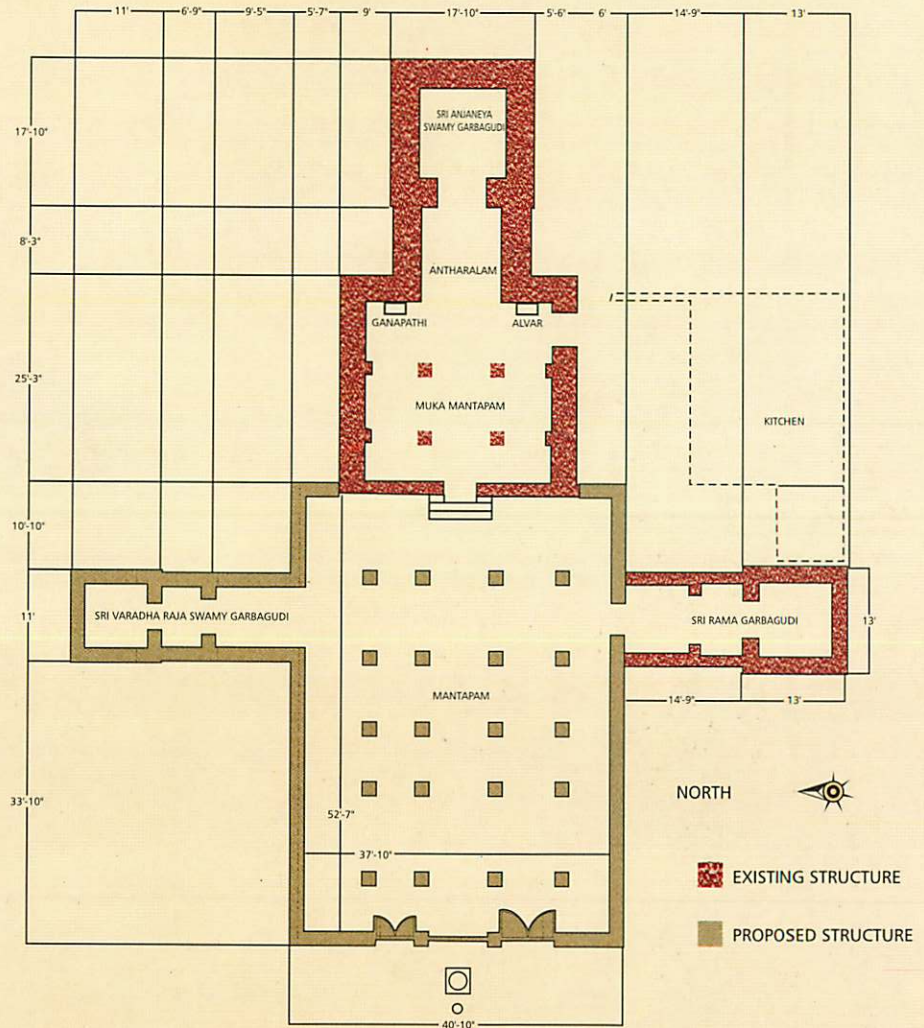
Existing Gopuram of Anjaneyaswamy Temple

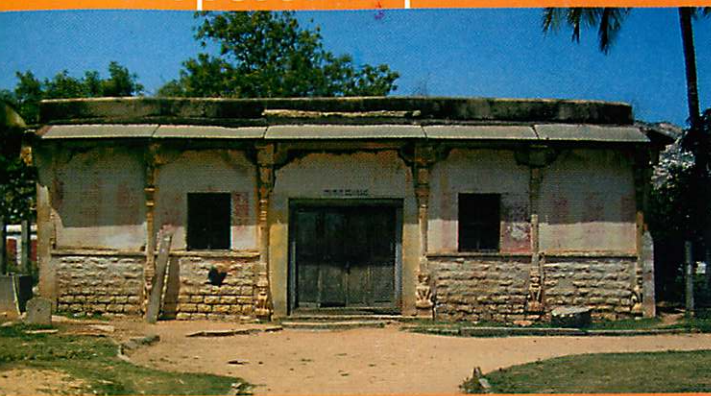
Existing Anjaneyaswamy Temple ▲

Plan showing the Existing temple of Sri Anjaneya Swamy, Mulbagal

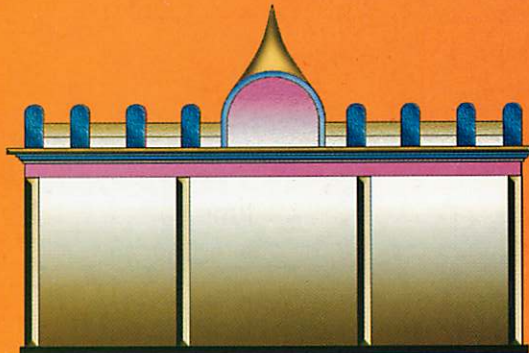

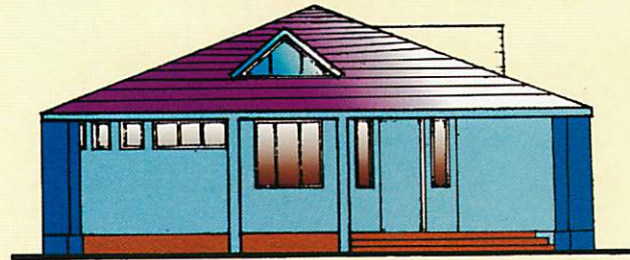

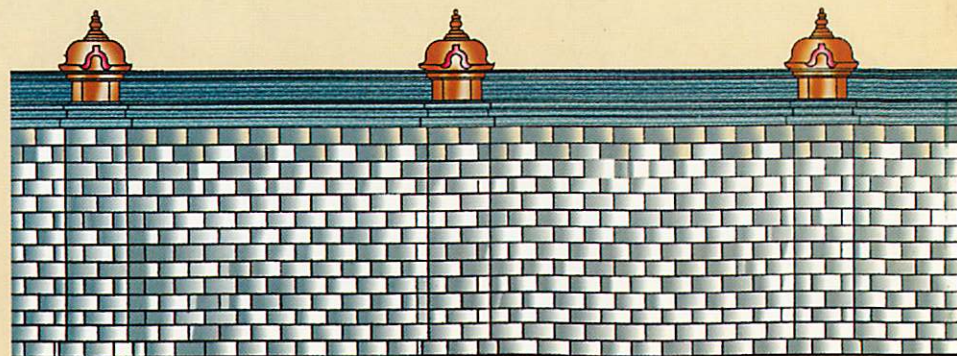
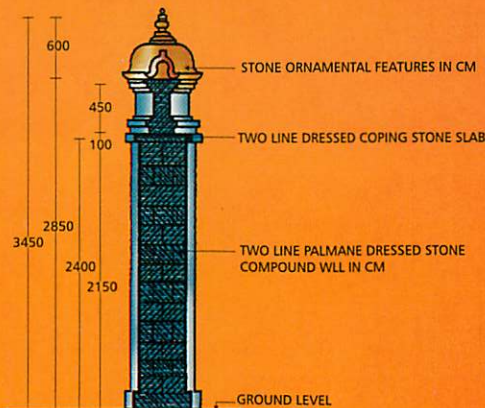

SRI ANJANEYA TEMPLE MULBAGAL (KARNATAKA)

Sri Anjaneyaswamy Temple, at Mulubagilu, Kolar District is a very important Temple in Karnataka, reflecting the rich religious and cultural heritage of South India. The idol of Sri Veeranjaneya Swamy, as per Hindu Mythology is supposed to have been installed by Arjuna in Dwarapayuga. The place was then known as Bhaskar Kshetra Kadalivana or Anjanadri.

The Temple town of Mulubagilu is also known as Eastern Gateway to Tirumala Hills. It is well known that at a time when there was no fast mode of communication pilgrims from Karnataka on the way to Tirumala-Tirupathi would first pay their obeisance to veeranjaneya temple at Mulubagilu. The temple has attracted great souls like jeevadasa, peethambaradas, Akbar, Beerabal, Thodarmal etc., whose statues are installed in the temple.

The temple conglomerate is said to have been renovated during the reign of Sri Krishna Devaraya and Tippu Sultan. Over a period of time the number of pilgrims visiting a temple has dropped down and temple is going into ruins.

The Vimana Gopura the once pride of the temple is sinking. The Kalyani which once catered to the needs of the temple has now gone into ruins. The Tonsure Centre (Mudikatte) the Ratha Mantapa and the best part of Sri Kodandaramaswamy, Govindarajaswamy and Venkataramanaswamy Temple have all lost their original glory due to lack of maintenance.

Efforts have been made by the devout few to effect repairs here and there, but the magnitude of work is enormous. Mulubagilu being a semi Urban Town is not in a position to command huge resources required for reconstruction to restore the temple premises to its old glory. Hence, we have decided to solicit the kindness and support of people who can afford. The total cost of the project is estimated at Rs. 10 million and every ounce of support towards this holy cause is most welcome.

SRI ANJANEYA TEMPLE MULBAGAL (KARNATAKA)

1. Construction of Vimana Gopura

To existing frontage is proposed to rest the new Gopuram on beams and columns and to construct a five stored Vimana Gopuram. The 30 feet high Gopuram will be constructed with the assistance of Structural Engineers and Professionals at cost of Rs. 1.1 million.

2. Front porting of Sri Anjaneyaswamy Temple

The existing frontage is propose to be altered with beautiful ornamental carvings of gray stone depicting Dashavathara. The work will be executed by a Master Shilpi. The height of the structure will be about 12 feet all along the length of Sri Anjaneya Temple. Cost of the work is about Rs. 3.6 million.

3. Construction of Mudikatte

The existing Mudikatte (Tonsure Center) which is in a dilapidated conditions is proposed to be reconstructed in the same architectural style of the whole temple. This will cost about Rs.1.2 million.

4. Restoration of Vahana Mantapa

The Vahana Mantapa which was once the pride of the temple with Monolithic pillar covering the vast expanse of space has now gone into ruins because of disuse and lack of maintenance. This requires total renovation and would cost about Rs.0.25 million.

5. Improvement of Temple within the Premises

The Varadarajaswamy Temple and Sri Kodandaramaswamy Temple as

also few minor structure with in the temple premises require extensive renovation. This will cost about rs. 0.2 million.

Within the temple premises lot of works need to be done like construction of roads, overhead Tank, gardening, Landscaping, improvement of open yard, lighting etc., without which the restoration will not complete. All these works cost about Rs. 15.5 million.

The work of restoration has already started in a small way by drilling a bore well. The Municipal Authorities have agreed to provide pump and accessories. It is proposed to take up the development of roads, both internal and external, landscaping and gardening immediately after the onset of monsoon.

Impressed by the vanity of our projects, the futility of our achievements, the restlessness of temporal life, its confusions and contradictions, its ultimate nothingness, the BHAGVAD GITA tells us that each one of us has to pass through it to achieve NIRVANA and spare your time and money to preserve Bhakti, Bhava and Buddhi.
